**Life Foundation**  
*was the first AIDS organization in Hawaii in 1983, and continues to be on the forefront of the fight against AIDS in Hawaii today.*

This past year, Life Foundation provided services to nearly 700 men, women, children, and trans-genders living with HIV/AIDS on the island of Oahu. Services included comprehensive case management, financial support, counseling, and a meals program.

Life Foundation also runs a comprehensive HIV prevention program that administered more than 2,400 free and anonymous HIV tests, distributed more than 50,000 free condoms, and made more than 21,500 contacts with individuals considered at high risk of contracting HIV.

Life Foundation spoke and presented at nearly 100 schools, community groups, health fairs, and rehab facilities, and organized public awareness events such as National HIV Testing Day, World AIDS Day, and the Honolulu AIDS Walk.



# Letter from the Executive Director & Board President

*Aloha,*

*Numbers. How many? How long? How much?*

It is hard to talk about HIV and AIDS without lapsing into the numbers. How many people are infected? What are the demographic percentages? What is the annual cost of antiretroviral medication regimens? And, the biggest number of them all – How many people have died?

Over the years, in our newsletters and annual reports, we have shared our numbers with you. We have told you how many clients we have, how many HIV tests we have performed, how many dollars it takes to maintain a responsive and healthy organization and speculated about how many years will pass before the scientific breakthrough that leads to a cure.

AIDS, however, is not a mathematical equation to be solved. It is a monumental human tragedy that is nearing the end of its third decade (another number) with no end in sight. While acknowledging the value of statistics, we would like to dedicate this annual report to the only number that really matters – the number “one”.

HIV infects people one at a time. AIDS continues to kill people one at a time. Human kindness is best administered on a one to one basis.

In the pages that follow, you will read stories – one by one – of people who have been affected by HIV and who have been associated with Life Foundation. You will meet clients who will talk about how HIV changed their lives. You will hear the voices of Life Foundation staff members and volunteers and learn how profoundly their lives have been impacted by the caring work they do in the unrelenting fight against HIV and AIDS.

In this report, we also thank the people, businesses, and organizations who have supported Life Foundation over the past year. Your support is also not just a number to us. Knowing that there are others in the community who care about our work deeply matters to our staff, clients, and volunteers. Your dedication to Life Foundation inspires us to keep helping those who need us most – one person at a time.

They have a women’s group that I attend, programs that help me connect with others who are infected, and they let me share my story with young adults: what life is like as an HIV-positive women.

*“One of my most memorable success stories at Life Foundation*

*is about a homeless, very sick client with whom I work.*

I had no contact information for him, and was only able to find him with the help of our nurse.

When I first met with this client, he had a broken arm, was medically fragile, and was living at the park. I asked the client to meet me the following day at the office, and when I came into work that morning, he was sitting outside the door holding my business card. He looked at me and said, “I want your help to find housing and get my life back on track.” I worked with the client heavily for over six months. He would come in to Life Foundation on a daily basis to get food and clean clothes. The client and I were able to get him stable housing, regular doctor’s visits, and access to medication.

Today, the client is doing better than ever. He reunited with his long time girlfriend and they were married last year. He still comes in to update me on his health and plans, and he has a positive outlook for his future.”

*“I was working with a young HIV-positive woman, pregnant with her second child.*

Her first child had been born negative, and she came to Life Foundation to get the help she needed to ensure her second child was born negative as well.

She was in an unstable housing situation and was lacking medical care. I worked with the young woman to get her into stable housing and connected with a nurse on the Leeward side of the island where she lived to have access to regular medical care.

With the help of Life Foundation, her baby was born HIV-negative.”

## *“Being diagnosed*

*with HIV is a shocking and numbing experience within itself.*

However, imagine trying to deal with being pregnant, suffering the loss of your baby’s father, and struggling to finish high school all at the same time.

While it is difficult to even believe, a client I worked with this year was experiencing just that. She continued to pursue her education and managed to graduate and receive her high school diploma. However, she struggled with alcohol and substance abuse problems, and eventually had her children taken away by Child Protective Services. It was then that she sought help and support from Life Foundation.

Life Foundation helped her find housing and a stable living environment in an effort to improve her own life in order to eventually reunite her with her children. She became involved with a number of our services and has even been a part of the Speakers Bureau, a program that sends HIV-positive individuals out into schools and communities to educate people about HIV and AIDS. Despite her troubles, she has been able to positively use her story as a learning experience for younger generations.

*“It seemed like an ordinary day: a routine trip to an organization to speak with a group about HIV 101.*

I covered all the basics: HIV prevention, testing, diagnosis, and progression of the disease. After the discussion was over, I was approached by a young lady. I test and do educational presentations to hundreds of individuals each year so I do not remember everyone I meet, but she clearly knew who I was.

It turned out that over a year ago, she was recommended by her doctor to take an HIV test. Terrified and alone, Crystal\* came into Life Foundation to be tested. I was the one who conducted Crystal’s test and provided her with all the information that she needed. While she came in scared and shaking, she left feeling confident, prepared, and informed. Even though it has been over a year since Crystal first stepped foot into Life Foundation, she still feels the impact of our knowledgeable and helpful staff.

After the event, Crystal not only came up to thank me, but also to recommend our services and programs to the other individuals present.”

*“I work on the 797A Project, a weekend retreat that provides a sense of community and support to transgender individuals.*

I had a client who I had to chase for over a year before finally convincing her to participate in our programs.

Sarah\*, a Kauai native, moved to Oahu after she graduated from high school. She lived her life in drag, but had worked at a stereotypically masculine job for over thirty-five years. While it may not have been widely accepted, she eventually began to embrace her lifestyle as a transgender individual and continued her transformation through beauty enhancements.

I met Sarah during one of Life Foundation’s outreach programs. While I persistently tried to get Sarah to come in to Life Foundation for services, Sarah would often say she would be there but never show up. But I never gave up on her.

This past year, Sarah finally came in and participated in one of our programs. Afterwards, she expressed her extreme gratitude and appreciation for everything that Life Foundation has to offer. If it weren’t for Life Foundation, Sarah may have completely fallen off of people’s radars. She may have found herself lost and confused in a world where many people do not accept or understand the transgender lifestyle. But thanks to Life Foundation, Sarah was able to find the support that she needed.”
